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The Associate of Applied Science degree in Blackfeet Studies is designed to enhance the student's knowledge of Blackfeet culture and values. The student will gain knowledge in the areas of language, history, arts and crafts, contemporary issues and other Native American Indian contributions to contemporary lifestyles. The Blackfeet Studies Program will prepare students for careers as cultural consultants, interpretation, Blackfeet mentors or tribal affairs.

The Learning Outcomes from the Blackfeet Studies degree program are as follows:

- Demonstrate a basic knowledge of Blackfeet culture, traditions, technologies, and language.
- Demonstrate cultural teaching models and methodologies.
- Relate to the Blackfeet human condition in the aspects of social, cultural and personal contexts.
