

Blackfeet Community College Electronic Technology Policy

“All electronic information management technology owned or controlled by the Blackfeet Community College must be utilized in a manner consistent with the stated educational goals, objectives, and academic mission adopted by the Blackfeet Community College. Any usage of said electronic technology, magnetic tape manipulation, Internet access and printers must be performed with academic research as the primary stated goal in the process of completing class assignments as they relate to the Blackfeet Community College.”

Such activities which might be considered unacceptable, and in violation of the Blackfeet Community College electronic technology policy include:

- Usage of BCC resource for personal financial gain, or private/public participation in activities counter to the stated BCC academic mission, philosophy, or policies
- Copy or use software, graphics, video or audio materials in violation of copyright or licensing laws
- Send or transmit harassing, threatening, or obscene mail, documents or pictures
- Access, view, or print obscene or pornographic images or documents
- Use BCC technology resources to illegally access communication, computer network or information services at BCC or elsewhere
- Use Internet “chat” services for personal communication

Any BCC student found to be in violation of this electronic technology policy will be directed to the course of administration as outlined in the BCC Student Handbook. The Dean of Student Services will be notified as to the violation of the BCC electronic technology policy.

Any BCC staff or faculty members found to be in violation of this electronic technology policy will be directed to the course of administration as outlined in the BCC Policy and Procedure manual. The supervisor of the BCC staff or faculty member will be notified as to the violation of the BCC electronic technology policy.

Computer Time Limits

All BCC Academic users will have a time limit of 2 hours:

We ask that you do all your academic work first before any personal / recreational usage, such as checking email, Facebook, chatting and leisure searching.

All Community Members / BCC Non-Academic users will have a time limit of 1 hour:

When all computers are in use, a BCC academic user will be given precedence to do their work. If necessary, we will ask another user to free up the computer.

All children age 14 and under will have a time limit of one half hour:

When all computers are in use, a BCC academic user will be given precedence to do their work. If necessary, we will ask another user to free up the computer.

All Enrolled Blackfeet Community College academic students have priority for use of the computers.

If all computers are full with Academic Students we ask that you please wait and when the next computer becomes available we will resume the first come, first served rule.
