#### **CELEBRATING TERRA BRAUHN'S ACHIEVEMENT AT THE EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION SUMMIT**

We're excited to announce that our colleague, Terra Brauhn, will present her poster, Empowering Educators through Culturally Relevant Early Childhood Education, at the 3rd Annual Early Childhood Education Summit, hosted by the University of Montana's Institute for Early Childhood Education. The event takes place April 3-5, 2025, in Missoula, Montana.

Terra's work highlights Blackfeet Community College's innovative approach to supporting early childhood educators on the Blackfeet Indian Reservation. Through a tailored Child Development Associate (CDA) program, developed in partnership with the Blackfeet Early Childhood Center, BFCC empowers community members to enhance their skills, pursue higher education, and contribute to the educational development of their community. The program offers flexible, stackable credits toward degrees in Early Childhood Education, accommodating working students' schedules. Additionally, it integrates trauma-informed teaching practices and emphasizes a culturally relevant curriculum rooted in Blackfeet culture and language. The summit is designed for teachers, coaches, and school leaders dedicated to early learning. Attendees will participate in breakout sessions, visit the UM Learning and Belonging (LAB) School, and engage in discussions on Project-Based Learning (PBL).

For those interested in attending, early bird registration is now open. Montana educators can register for free through the provided link. The event will be held at the University of Montana Phyllis J. Washington College of Education.

With the help of this incredible 10-inch reflector telescope, attendees had the rare opportunity to view celestial bodies such as Mars, Jupiter, and two of Jupiter's moons, including Europa. The evening also featured stunning sights like the Great Globular Cluster in Hercules and the Pleiades star cluster—all visible to the naked eye thanks to the expert guidance of the Glacier National Park Astronomy team.

A big thank you goes out to Dori, Sarah, and Eli from Glacier National Park for being such amazing partners and for bringing the beauty of the park's astronomy programs into our community. We are so grateful for their support and the opportunity to share these awe-inspiring experiences with the public.
