The event brought together tribal leadership, educators, employers, and workforce professionals to collaborate on building stronger pathways between education and employment in our region.

The day began with a warm Opening Prayer from Laura Gervais of the Knowledge Carriers Lodge at Blackfeet Community College, followed by welcoming remarks from Dr. Brad Hall, President of BFCC; Rodney Gervais Jr., Chairman of the Blackfeet Nation; and Wendy Bremner, Vice Chairwoman of the BFCC Board of Trustees.

CELEBRATING EARTH DAY AT BFCC: GROWING TOGETHER, ROOTED IN COMMUNITY

Blackfeet Community College recently welcomed spring with a spirited Earth Day celebration, hosted by the USDA Extension Program at BFCC. The event brought students, families, and community members together in honor of trees, sustainability, and the strength of our shared roots.

Thanks to the generous support of the Department of Natural Resources and Conservation (DNRC), attendees had the opportunity to take home a variety of native seedlings to plant and nurture. In total, the DNRC donated:

- 48 lilac bushes
- 96 serviceberry seedlings
- 33 two-year-old serviceberry plants
- 48 chokecherry seedlings
- 58 golden currant bushes

These trees and shrubs will soon take root throughout the community, helping to support local ecosystems and add beauty to our landscapes.

Participants from the BFCC Family Tree Program, community members, and students from Heart Butte School joined in the day's activities. Alongside the tree giveaway, guests enjoyed educational presentations on maple syrup production and soil amendments, blending tradition, science, and practical knowledge for all ages. The DNRC also supplied 20 Tree Campus USA hats, celebrating BFCC's commitment to environmental stewardship.

A heartfelt thank you to everyone who attended, supported, and helped grow this event from the ground up. Together, we're cultivating a greener, healthier future, one tree at a time.
