THIS SEMESTER, BLACKFEET COMMUNITY COLLEGE (BFCC) IS PROUD TO CONTINUE THE AAHSIIKS KOOKAN (KNOWLEDGE CARRIERS LODGE), A PROGRAM DEDICATED TO PROVIDING BLACKFEET NATION ELDERS WITH A WELCOMING SPACE ON CAMPUS, THE LODGE CONNECTS THESE KNOWLEDGE CARRIERS WITH COMMUNITY-BASED SERVICES AND OFFERS OPPORTUNITIES TO ENGAGE IN BFCC'S PROGRAMS, CREATING A BRIDGE BETWEEN GENERATIONS. FAMILIES AND GRANDCHILDREN ARE WELCOME, MAKING IT A TRULY INCLUSIVE SPACE. WEEKLY HOURS FOR THE LODGE ARE MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY, 10 AM TO 3 PM.

THE PROGRAM, LED BY NA'ASIKS AISPOM(K)TAKIIKS (HELPS WITH ELDERS), MRS. LAURA GERVAIS, MED, AND HER ASSISTANT KIM JIRON DEROCHE, FEATURES A RANGE OF ACTIVITIES SUCH AS MONTHLY ELDER LUNCHEONS, CRAFT WEDNESDAYS (2 PM TO 4 PM), AND BI-WEEKLY SOUP TUESDAYS WITH GUEST SPEAKERS. THE PROGRAM ALSO SHARES A "BLACKFEET WORD OF THE WEEK" ON SOCIAL MEDIA AND THE COLLEGE WEBSITE. IN PARTNERSHIP WITH EAGLE SHIELDS CENTER, THE BLACKFEET DOMESTIC VIOLENCE PROGRAM, MEDICINE SPRING LIBRARY, AND CULTURE AND HOPE PROGRAM. THE AAHSIIKS KOOKAN AIMS TO ENRICH BOTH THE ELDERS AND THE COMMUNITY.

STUDENTS ARE STRONGLY ENCOURAGED TO JOIN THE AAHSIIKS KOOKAN STUDENT BFCC CLUB TO SUPPORT THESE EFFORTS AND WORK DIRECTLY WITH THE ELDERS. 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TYLER BROWN: A JOURNEY THROUGH THE USDA EQUITY PROGRAM

TYLER BROWN, A PAST PARTICIPANT OF THE USDA EQUITY PROGRAM, REFLECTS ON HIS JOURNEY THROUGH THE PROGRAM AND ITS IMPACT ON HIS LIFE. INITIALLY UNSURE OF HIS CAREER PATH AFTER HIGH SCHOOL, TYLER DECIDED TO GIVE COMMUNITY COLLEGE A TRY AND QUICKLY FOUND VALUE IN THE EQUITY PROGRAM. HIS FAVORITE PART WAS THE BLACKFEET LANGUAGE CLASS, WHICH TOOK HIM ON UNIQUE FIELD TRIPS TO HISTORICAL SITES, INCLUDING MUSEUMS IN CANADA AND HELENA, AND LOCAL AREAS LIKE UPPER TWO MEDICINE AND ST. MARY'S. THESE EXPERIENCES NOT ONLY DEEPENED HIS CONNECTION TO HIS HERITAGE BUT ALSO PREPARED HIM FOR THE TRANSITION TO UNIVERSITY LIFE.

TYLER NOW SHARES HIS EXPERIENCE WITH YOUNGER COMMUNITY MEMBERS, ENCOURAGING THEM TO ENROLL IN THE PROGRAM AS A WAY TO EXPLORE THEIR INTERESTS AND CAREER OPTIONS. AFTER COMPLETING THE PROGRAM, TYLER TOOK TIME TO EXPLORE VARIOUS OUTDOOR CAREERS AND MOVED TO DIFFERENT CITIES, INCLUDING MISSOULA AND ALBUQUERQUE, TO EXPERIENCE NEW OPPORTUNITIES. HE CREDITS THE WRITING SKILLS HE GAINED THROUGH THE EQUITY PROGRAM WITH HELPING HIM SECURE SCHOLARSHIPS AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MONTANA. TYLER EMPHASIZES THE IMPORTANCE OF TAKING ACTION, APPLYING THE LESSONS HE LEARNED TO WHATEVER FUTURE CAREER OR ADVENTURE MAY COME HIS WAY.

HONOR YOUR LIFE: A DAY OF HEALING AND COMMUNITY SUPPORT

THE BLACKFEET COMMUNITY COLLEGE RECENTLY HOSTED A POWERFUL "HONOR YOUR LIFE" EVENT IN COLLABORATION WITH SEVERAL LOCAL PROGRAMS, INCLUDING THE BLACKFEET DOMESTIC VIOLENCE PROGRAM AND THE CULTURE AND HOPE PROGRAM. THIS INITIATIVE BROUGHT TOGETHER COMMUNITY MEMBERS AFFECTED BY SUICIDE LOSS TO SHARE EXPERIENCES AND DEVELOP EFFECTIVE COPING STRATEGIES.TONI RUNNINGFISHER, DIRECTOR OF HOLISTIC WELLNESS AT BFCC, COLLABORATED WITH PARTNER PROGRAMS TO CREATE AND FACILITATE THIS IMPACTFUL EVENT. THE DAY FEATURED A RANGE OF ACTIVITIES AND PRESENTATIONS FOCUSED ON MINDFULNESS, SELF-CARE STRATEGIES, AND BUILDING SUPPORT SYSTEMS. CULTURAL ELEMENTS PLAYED A SIGNIFICANT ROLE, INCLUDING A MOVING PERFORMANCE BY LELAND LUKIN, WHO SANG A SONG HONORING THOSE LOST TO SUICIDE, ANGEL LITTLE PLUME SPOKE ON THE HEALING POWER OF THE JINGLE DRESS DANCE, FOLLOWED BY A PERFORMANCE BY BHS JINGLE DRESS DANCERS. NOTABLE SPEAKERS TERRANCE LAFROMBOISE, MSW-ITR, AND DONNIE WETZEL, CEO OF MONTANA INDIAN ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME. ALSO SHARED THEIR INSIGHTS.THIS COLLABORATIVE EFFORT EXEMPLIFIED THE COMMUNITY'S COMMITMENT TO ADDRESSING MENTAL HEALTH CHALLENGES AND PROMOTING HEALING THROUGH A BLEND OF TRADITIONAL WISDOM AND MODERN SUPPORT STRATECIES, BY BRINGING TOGETHER VARIOUS PROGRAMS AND CULTURAL ELEMENTS, THE EVENT PROVIDED A HOLISTIC APPROACH TO SUPPORTING THOSE AFFECTED BY SUICIDE LOSS AND STRENGTHENING COMMUNITY RESILIENCE.

THE DAYS OF THE PIIKANI TOOK PLACE ON SEPTEMBER 25TH AND 26TH. GATHERING THE BLACKFEET NATION COMMUNITY FOR A RICH EXCHANGE OF CULTURE AND KNOWLEDGE. THE EVENT KICKED OFF ON THE FIRST DAY WITH INSIGHTFUL SESSIONS, STARTING WITH A KEYNOTE ADDRESS ON THE LAME BULL TREATY BY CLIFF HALL, PARTICIPANTS THEN ENGAGED IN DISCUSSIONS LED BY VERNON MARCEAU AND A PANEL ON BUFFALO PRESERVATION FEATURING EMMETTE DUSTYBULL, BRANDON KITTSON. AND KENNY BIRD. IN THE AFTERNOON, ATTENDEES COULD CHOOSE TO EITHER ATTEND WILBERT FISH'S PRESENTATION ON HERBAL MEDICINE AT UPPER CUT BANK CREEK OR OTHER ENGAGING SESSIONS, INCLUDING STEPHANIE BOSTWICK ON THE DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY, MIKE BRUISED HEAD DISCUSSING BLACKFEET LANGUAGE IN WATERTON PARK, AND FELIX NEZ FROM USDA EXTENSION SHOWCASING STUDENT PROJECTS. THE DAY ALSO FEATURED DARNELL RIDESATHEDOOR DISCUSSING BLACKFEET HERBOLOGY AND CONCLUDED WITH DANIELLE CERVAIS PRESENTING ON THE FAST BLACKFEET INITIATIVE. OVERALL THE DAYS OF THE PIIKANI CELEBRATED BLACKFEET CULTURE AND COMMUNITY. REINFORCING THE IMPORTANCE OF SHARING KNOWLEDGE ACROSS GENERATIONS.








