Blackfeet Community College (BCC), established in 1976, is an accredited tribally controlled Land grant community college. BCC serves up to six hundred students in transfer and non-transfer two-year degrees, two-plus-two, transfer degrees and certificate, vocational and community programs. BCC is an eight hundred acre campus located within the Blackfeet Indian Reservation in Browning, Montana.

Mission Statement

The purpose of Blackfeet Community College is to provide the Blackfeet Nation and our “universal community” access to quality education programs that prepare students for achievement in higher education, meaningful employment, basic skill instruction, and community education, while integrating the Blackfeet Culture and Language.

Duties:

The President, reporting to the college’s Board of Trustees, is responsible for the leadership, management and supervision of academic, administrative and student services programs. These responsibilities are guided by public relations, marketing, fiscal growth and audit compliance, personnel and organizational capacity, student success and technological advancement. Assessment is data driven.

In addition, the president is responsible for the implementation of the College’s Charter, By-laws, Policies and Procedures and the higher education purposes of the Blackfeet Nation in accordance with the Northwest Commission on College and Universities accreditation standards.

Qualifications:

- Doctorate degree from an accredited university OR
- Master’s degree from an accredited university

Experience:

- Ten years of experience in higher education administration; to include
 - a. Knowledge of Tribally Controlled Community College Act and higher education programs;
 - b. Knowledge of Native Indigenous, and American Indian culture and traditions; OR
- Five years of successful experience with budgets, fiscal growth and audit compliance;
- Five years of experiences in fund raising and federal/state/private grant management; AND
- Exemplar human relations skills;
- Commitment to a thriving multicultural environment;
- Provide ethical and regulatory oversight of research that involves human subjects;
- Understanding of Institutional Research Protocols and Higher Education Ethics as it relates to Native Americans;
- Excellent written and oral communication skills.

Salary:

Preference:
